

## President's Report by Roy Burchill



Finally, construction on Torrey South is finished! Part of the TPMGC membership "experience" is playing around this maintenance, the Farmers Insurance Open and the US Open. Except for regular course maintenance, the next year and a half should be a great time to be a member and have access to our two beautiful home courses!

There are some interesting changes on South. Most of the bunkers have lower lips. Many of the bunkers have been moved resulting in tighter tee shots on several holes including 4, 9, 10, 12, 13, and 17. A few holes have new collection areas meaning you will have to chip from tight lies or have a challenging putt. Several additional trees were lost to disease including the grove left of 10 fairway. But the overall experience of playing Torrey South is still fabulous!

I hope you are able to attend our upcoming General Meeting on November 4 at Bernardo Heights CC. Last year we had a casual golf outing prior to the event and this year the golf will be a bonus tournament with the normal prizes. We will also be served a delicious plated dinner. It's a great opportunity to play a private course, chat with old friends and meet some new ones, eat a free meal and vote for your 2020 Board Members. If you can't golf then just come for dinner.

We are continuing to update the newsletter. A new feature is "Tap-Ins" which covers topics too short for an article. We will also be regularly recognizing our current Champion Golfers of the Year. Each newsletter will list our current major champion winners.

## Membership Fees

Our annual renewal fee of \$100 and new member fee of \$250 remain unchanged in 2020. But the Board did approve some other changes to our membership fees.

Members who renew after their due date will pay a \$50 late fee rather than the new member fee of \$250. This \$50 late fee applies if the member renews within 12 months of their renewal date. If members let their membership lapse for a year or more, they will have to pay the new member fee of \$250 to rejoin the club.

There is a new membership category called "Inactive Status". We know that sometimes you might face situations such as health problems, change in your finances, or other personal situations that might force you to let your membership lapse. Instead of letting it lapse, you can now request to be placed in an inactive status for a period of up to 2 years. Requests for inactive status must be emailed to the club's membership chair for approval prior to the date your membership expires. While inactive, you pay no dues and are not eligible to participate in any club activities. To return to active status, you must pay the annual dues plus the \$50 late renewal fee. Members who return from inactive status after two years must pay the new member fee.

## Rules of Play During TPMGC Tournaments

It is important that all members know and play by the Rules of Golf as well as local rules during club tournaments.

Here are some local rules specific to tournaments played at Torrey Pines.

1. The SD City golf app has Green Reading Guides. You may not refer to these during any tournaments. Any member using this feature of the app will be DQ'd.
2. There is no longer relief from native areas such as right of #4 and #5 on Torrey North. When the course reopened, relief was granted to let the plants mature.
3. If your ball lands in the gravel to the left of #9 on Torrey South, play it as ground under repair and take free relief.
4. If you hit your ball in the penalty area short of the green on #12 at Torrey North, the drop area for the next shot is between the gold tee markers.
5. You may continue to drop without penalty from: staked trees, unpaved roads/paths and flowerbeds.
6. Often course maintenance is taking place during our tournaments. Unless the tournament chair has informed all players that relief is to be taken from aeration holes, seams in newly sodded grass, or other temporary issues resulting from course maintenance, then you may not take relief. It is important that all members play tournaments under the same conditions.

## Pace of Play by Ed Carter

Throughout 2019 our pace of play has gradually improved. Thanks to you, the time it takes us to complete tournament rounds is decreasing. It certainly helps when Torrey Pines sheds it's winter roughs but we have encouraging signs that our speed-of-play habits are working.

Here's what appears to work:

- Forward tees are assigned to players in the highest-handicap flight (assigned tees are identified on tournament scorecards).
- Players are playing ready golf on the tees, in the fairways and on the greens making sure they are ready to play when it's their turn..
- Early in the round, groups are deciding to either leave the flagstick in or leave it out. We've learned that continuously putting it in and taking it out wastes time.
- When players have only a tap-in left, they go ahead and putt out then proceed to the next tee (when required to catch up to the group ahead of them).
- Players are helping each other find lost balls, making sure each search lasts no longer than 3 minutes (in accordance with 2019's new set of USGA rules).

How do we know our pace of play is improving? We're keeping stats. Data captured from scorecard timestamps over a recent 8-month period (22 tournaments) show we had an average pace of 4:23 and a low violation rate of 5.4% (finishing more than 15 minutes after the group ahead is a pace violation if pace is over 4:20).

Keep up the good work!

## Grand - Torrey Cup

We are pleased to announce a new benefit for members, but it is a benefit that will be earned by members through stellar golf.

Last April, the head pro at the Grand Del Mar contacted our club interested in scheduling a home and away match. We were able to secure a few tee times at Torrey Pines and the matches were on!


Each club brought a team of 24 players with handicaps ranging from 2 to 22. The format was better ball of partners match play. Because of the short notice, the Torrey Pines team consisted primarily of board members and a club member invited to partner with the board member. Also, playing were the weekday and weekend champions of our SCGA Qualifier Better Ball of Partner tournaments.

The front and back nines were each worth 1 point and the overall match was also worth a point. So, there were three points total available in each match. The matches were tight. The first round was played at Torrey North with our team prevailing by a score of 20 -16. Unfortunately, we lost at the Grand by a score of 23.5 - 12.5. The final score was the Grand: 39.5 and Torrey Pines 32.5. Kudos to the team of Marc Couillard and Brian Hickey who were the only players on either team to win all 6 points.

We plan on these matches being an annual event. Each year we will schedule several Better Ball of Partners tournaments in addition to the SCGA qualifiers. Members who win those tournaments will be invited to participate in this event.

The Grand purchased a perpetual trophy. Their name is on it for 2019, but we plan on housing it at Torrey Pines for a long time beginning in 2020!

Members will have several opportunities to qualify by winning one the designated better ball of partner tournaments that will be scheduled in 2020.

**CIF- San Diego Chapter:** Our donation underwrites a portion of the championship green fees for the annual boys and girls high school championship...

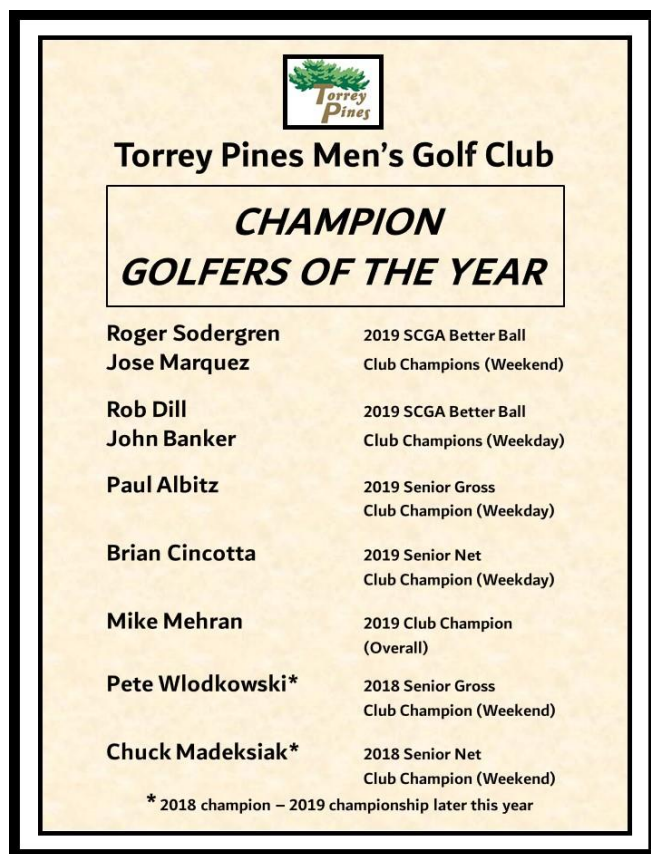

## Torrey Pines Senior Match Play Team

Torrey Pines is a member of the San Diego County Senior Golf League ([www.sdscgolfleague.com](http://www.sdscgolfleague.com)). There are currently 19 teams in the league. Players in the league must be over 55 years of age. Our team currently has 41 players so each person plays from 2-3 matches per year. The league's regular season is from late January thru October with playoffs in November.

Each match consists of 6 players from each team. We play one home and one away match against each team. Currently, our home course is Riverwalk Golf Course. The home team pays for the visitors' golf and lunch at their home course. The match play format is partner match play with each hole worth a potential of two points. The objective is to beat your opponent on each hole and not necessarily to shoot a career round. Getting a 6 on a hole when your opponent gets a 7 is all that matters.

Our team finished in first place a couple of years ago. This year has been more difficult. After a slow start, our team has picked up some momentum and is fighting for a playoff spot. The top 8 teams make the playoffs. But with only 2 matches left it may be a little too late.
