As Chair of the Pace of Play (POP) Committee, I analyze the data from each tournament and maintain the player database on the time gaps between groups as reported by Golf Genius. We implemented the POP policy a year ago to emphasize the importance of keeping up with the group in front of you. To date, we have had only three members who have collected too many points over a five-tournament sequence to incur further penalties of tee time restrictions. For a typical tournament, we might have two-three groups who finish more than 15 minutes behind the group in front of them.

If you are not aware of the policy, please take time to read it on the website under the TOURNAMENTS subheading. Often, people who contacted about slow play were not familiar with the policy.

The good news is that we have greatly improved our POP at Torrey Pines over the last year. For the last few weekday tournaments (with no public players inserted in the middle of our tee times), including the Senior Championships, our mean completion time has been around four hours, with the final groups coming in often under 4:15. This helps the club in its relationship with the city, as POP has been a concern raised by the city in past years.

For both the weekend and weekday tournaments, some groups enter scores into Golf Genius before they have finished the final hole. When you do this, you are cheating the group behind you, and groups have been penalized accordingly. We monitor this through a variety of ways, so if you think it is worth it to save a potential one-point penalty, you will eventually get caught and the penalty will be far more severe.

Winnings from Torrey Tournaments.

Since September, 2022 all winnings from *Tournaments at Torrey Pines* are transferred to the TP Pro Shop. This is a requirement of our permit with the City. You can only spend the money at the Pro Shop. You can use this for merchandise (you get a 20% discount), cart fees, range balls, and other items. It is up to each member to keep track of the winnings that are transferred over and how much they spend. Maintaining a spreadsheet would be very helpful. Winnings from away tournaments still remain in your TPMGC account. You can access those dollars by contacting Steve Shushan

Sufficient Funds in Your Account

Many of our away tournaments are prepaid and you must have sufficient funds in your account to pay for the green fee and \$15 tournament fee. When you sign up for a tournament, be sure to check your account balance. If you do not have enough money, immediately add more funds. This way you won't get several emails to do this. If you don't add funds to your account by the cancellation deadline you will be dropped from the tournament.



TPMGC Volunteer Program

The City considers access to the Torrey Pines golf courses a privilege due to the unique nature of Torrey Pines being a world-class municipal facility. The City wants our club and the TPWGC to "earn" continued access by volunteer efforts that grow and give back to the game of golf. I wanted to give an update on our volunteer efforts to date. TPMGC has or will apply **1,594 volunteer** hours so far in 2023 in the following programs.

Course Marshals

Our Volunteer Marshal Program has been widely accepted by our members and highly successful in reducing the Pace of Play.

- Thru the end of June, we have marshaled for 31 events accumulating a total 152 hours YTD and providing these Marshal members 62 priority registrations.
- Please read our whole story on our TPMGC website by using the Volunteer pull down menu. Click on Tournament Marshals there you will have several options to choose. Including an up-to-date schedule showing available dates thru the end of the year
- We encourage you to request any date that will fit into your schedule. Several of our marshals will gladly give up one of their days for you.
- By offering a mere 4 hours of your time, we will provide you the opportunity to guarantee a priority registration at a Torrey Pines tournament You will have up to 3 months to use that priority.
- You can also volunteer to be a course Marshal for public play on dates that TPMGC does not have tournaments. The City places a high value on volunteer efforts for Public Play

Divot Patrol

The City places a high value on TPMGC's efforts as "Divoteers". 19 TPMGC members have signed up as Divoteers. 14 have completed or signed up for 22 shifts (88 hours) 5 members have requested priority registration. We are asking you to sign up as a Divoteer. Our goal is to annually apply more hour as Divoteers than other volunteer opportunities. Shifts are available Monday through Friday in the morning and evening. Contact Al Allison <u>alallisongolf@gmail.com</u> to sign up for the Divot Patrol. We are working to streamline the sign-up process for the Divot Patrol.

Other Golf Volunteer Events

- San Diego Junior Golf Association 10 TPMGC members have signed up or worked a total of 11 shifts (44 hours) at SDJGA events. One member has used his priority registration.
- Junior World 23 TPMGC Members have signed up for 56 shifts (224 hours) at the Jr World competition. The tournament starts July 8th.
- **City Amateur** 8 TPMGC Members signed up and will work one shift (32 hours) on 7/15 or 7/16. The shifts were split with the TPWGC members.
- Farmers Insurance Open 35 TPGMC members applied 1,056 hours at the FIO.

We are working with the City to identify other Golf events that TPMGC can get credit for volunteer hours, so stay tuned.



Torrey Team Play Opportunities 2024 by Jamie Ogle

The Torrey Pines Men's Golf Club has a few different opportunities for team play in 2024. For the past three years we have participated in the *SCGA Weekend Team Play* tournament. We advanced to the playoffs in our first year. Last year, our weekend home course was Torrey Pines North and we plan to do that again in 2024. Your captains are Jamie Ogle and Matt Van Meeteren. We are hoping to add a *Weekday SCGA Team (Thursdays)* as well and your captains will be Jamie Ogle and Roy Burchill.

SCGA team play's regular season runs from January to March with playoffs potentially until mid-April. There are 3 home matches and 3 away matches against 3 other clubs. Regular season matches consist of 16 golfers against 16 golfers playing for 6 points per match in head to head net match play and a fourball net match. We will be looking for 16 regular players and about 10 substitute players. All handicaps are welcome.

We also have a *TPMGC Senior Team* that is captained by Paul Lawrence that plays its home matches at Rancho Bernardo Inn. The *TPMGC Senior Team* runs from March to October and 6 players play per match. There are 15 home and away matches. Players must be at least 55 years old and most players play in 3 matches. All matches are on weekdays. All handicaps are welcome. Prior to next season, we will be emailing our membership to let members know about the details of our various team play opportunities and give members the opportunity to sign up to be considered for the teams.
